## Idaho Gives...Will You?

On May 1st the Valley County Museum, administered by the Long Valley Preservation Society, will join other Idaho nonprofits in a 24 hour period of on-line fundraising known as Idaho Gives!. The Idaho Nonprofit Center organized the event as a day to celebrate the awesome work of Idaho's nonprofits and allow them to benefit from the power of many.

Idaho Gives! was launched in 2013 as a new way for nonprofits to reach donors, and that first year participants raised \$578,735 through 9,415 donations from 6,192 individual donors directed at 541 causes!

There are two things fans, supporters, and lovers of the Valley County Museum and Historic Roseberry can do to help:

**First,** spread the word about this fundraiser to your friends and your email list. Tell them that on May 1st, you are going to go on-line and donate to your favorite outdoor museum at Historic Roseberry! Tell them about the work we do, give them an event schedule, or mention the projects we still need to complete. This information is available on our website at <u>historicroseberry.com</u>.

**Second,** on May 1st go to <u>www.idahogives.org</u>. There you will see a search box with the words "Find a Cause". Type in Historic Roseberry, Valley County Museum, **or** Long Valley Preservation Society. This will take you to a page that suggests Long Valley Preservation Society. Click on that name, and you will be taken to our own individual page, with photos and stories for you to enjoy. There, using a credit card, you can update or increase the level of your membership or make a special donation.



The funds raised during the 24 hour period will be used at the Museum for repairing the stage at the barn, beginning restoration of the teacherage behind the schoolhouse, and

for general operating costs. Donor information and emails will be captured to enable the LVPS to properly thank you.

There are many cash prizes (donated by business sponsors of the event) awarded to organizations who do especially well, or meet other requirements. Wouldn't it be wonderful if the Valley County Museum earned one of these special gifts!
