Bluer Than Blue - Quilt Raffle 2014





Restoration Treasures

Treasures from the past came to light this summer when board members began to empty and catalogue the storage of many years in the tiny building known as the Teacherage in preparation for it's restoration. The building was donated by




Rachel Stone, a member of the Loomis family, and once served as the family home. When it was brought to Roseberry




it was stuffed full of miscellanea: original furnishings found within were a kitchen cook stove, milk bottles in wooden boxes, a blue kitchen hutch, and an historic mattress still stuffed with Long Valley hay. Other finds included a marriage certificate, a photograph of a patriarch (presumably Frank Loomis),

an ornamental marriage certificate for Loomis and wife, a high

chair and baby items. Many of the furnishings and artifacts will be accessioned and used to create displays and dioramas in buildings around the site, including the Mahala House, which will hold exhibits highlighting the challenges and triumphs of women who settled and raised families in Long Valley (see article page 2).

Mahala House Exhibit:

Daily Life of Frontier Women

The Mahala House, donated to LVPS by the Barker family, will be the next restoration project funded by the LVPS. Under the direction of Preservation Specialist Frank Eld and his wife Kathy, the 1920's era frame structure will be home to exhibits illuminating the life of an early female settler of Long Valley. Late addition cabinets will be torn out of the kitchen, the bathroom will be removed, and the laundry room and dining room will be decorated with the appropriate period furnishings including the blue hutch found in the teacherage. The porch will be rebuilt, and period clothing will hang on clothes lines. In the dormered upstairs, exhibits will focus on the crafts and creations of the homesteader such as quilts, rugs, and weavings, When completed, the kitchen will host cooking demonstrations by interpreters.

Outreach Program Launched


LVPS board members Lucy Chronic and Sandy Cottrell, accompanied by accessionist Bev Ingraham recently designed and presented two off-site educational programs. This spring, before the High Valley road opened, the trio drove to Ola to address 85 retired teachers from Squaw Butte. Topics included Roseberry history, a brief overview of the founding of the LVPS, and accessioning anecdotes, with photographs for display and books from the Museum Gift Shop. In May, Sandy and Lucy, accompanied by two Master Naturalists, introduced fourth grade students to the challenges of early Idaho settlers, in an original game called Homesteading in Valley County 1880. This interactive all-day event was taught by several groups and attended by 40 students at Trinity Pines Camp, and was sponsored by the Horseshoe Bend Outdoor Education Program. Both informational programs can be offered to other groups around Idaho as requested. New Exhibits Spruce Up Museum

Three new exhibits have been developed for the museum building. The first, *Once Upon A Time Town*, features photographs of towns that grew up around post offices, then faded when the railroad came through the valley. The second is *How Did We Communicate Before...*, and is an interactive children's display including printing press, manual typewriter, and switchboard. The third shows snow depths from 1888 onward beginning with 8 feet!!
