

#### What 2016 looked like...



Volunteers spent over 200 hours working in the Research Center, 200 hours staffing the museum, 160 hours staffing the store, 240 hours fundraising, 150 hours restoring/painting/ building, 150 hours planning, and 60 hours providing education for children.

The Johnson Cabin was moved to museum land. Two buildings received rebuilt roofs, and the band shell was painted.

Experts were consulted and plans were finalized in preparation for the summer 2017 replacement of the rotting wooden foundation under the General Store. The General Store, purchased in 2015 with a generous gift from the Nasi Fund, was thoroughly cleaned, and an exhibit of Childhood Toys was put up.

Two extensive artifact collections were donated by Marilyn Whitson and the descendants of Eilene Evans, and accessioned in the Nelle Tobias Research Center along with many single items.

The family of the late Lloyd Ax donated their 100 year old Finn-built log cabin, with pictures of the builders and the tools used to scribe the logs. This acquisition will be moved to the museum site and restored during the summer of 2017.

Educational programs included the Weekly Kids History program and the History Evenings for adults, both held evenings in July and August. 4th Grade Idaho History students from Barbara Morgan Elementary and Cascade Elementary visited the museum for two days each to enjoy classes in the one-room schoolhouse, picnic on the Nasi Com- mons, and take part in old-fashioned fun and games. Many came in period costume.
